What is the Alumni Advisory Board?

The AAB will connect, celebrate, and represent the global Brunel alumni community to enrich the quality of our alumni and student offering. You'll be the voice of our graduates and represent the alumni community to make a positive and lasting impact on our global alumni network, our students, and the wider Brunel community.

Consisting of a selection of up to 10 alumni volunteers, the AAB will work in partnership with the Development and Alumni Relations Office (DARO) to advise and provide expertise and feedback on current and future engagement strategies and help us to communicate our vision externally.

Key asks

- Members are asked to commit to the AAB for a two-year term and participation is undertaken on a voluntary basis.
- Attend three online meetings per year, review all pre-meeting literature, and maintain an understanding of the higher education sector.
- Be an ambassador and show support for Brunel, have a passion for its future development and be engaged with our strategies and initiatives.
- Provide ideas on how to best engage with our global alumni network.
- Share advice on how to develop our lifelong offering of support to our alumni community.
- Provide ideas and feedback on fundraising projects, how to best engage with donors, policies, strategic plans and new initiatives.
