Academic Word: **Lecture** /'lek.tʃə/

Meaning: a talk given to teach students in a university

Collocations: to **go to** a **lecture**
 to **attend** a **lecture on** something
 to **give** a **lecture**

Example: I went to an interesting lecture on Russian history today.

General English expression: **Cheers** /tʃɪəz/

Meaning 1: a friendly expression before drinking an alcoholic drink

Examples: “Cheers everyone!”

Meaning 2: an informal way to say ‘thank you’ in the UK

Example: “Excuse me, did you drop your wallet?” “Oh cheers!”

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
