

SENATE REGULATION 7 (February 2021 onwards): Collaborative Provision

1 Under the <u>Supplemental Charter</u>, the University is empowered to confer and withdraw academic awards, to collaborate with other institutions and individuals to confer joint and other awards, and to affiliate or incorporate another institution.

2 <u>Council Ordinance 9</u> confirms that Senate is responsible for regulating, governing and quality assuring the University's academic provision, the authorising of degrees (other than honorary degrees), and establishing or terminating collaborative academic partnerships.

3 Procedures for the approval and management of collaborative academic partnerships are set out in a Code of Practice approved by Senate.

4 All awards made under a collaborative academic partnership must be of an equivalent academic standard to awards for programmes delivered by the University.

5 Senate will approve the mode and location of delivery of collaborative academic partnership programmes.

6 Students registered on a programme at Brunel University London may complete some of their studies at another institution within the UK or overseas. Senate approval is required for any such arrangements.

7 Where programmes of study result in an award from Brunel University London, the partner institution should comply with the Senate Regulations, unless Senate confirms otherwise.

8 Partner institutions should comply with Brunel University London's requirements for quality assurance and enhancement, and for student support and guidance, unless Senate confirms otherwise.
