

KEY INFORMATION ON POLICY FOR COURSEWORK SUBMISSION

	STUDENTS
Submitting coursework on time	 Make use of your coursework schedule at the beginning of term, to plan for deadlines Understand when, where and how to hand in work Check whether submitting on time is a professional requirement of your programme
Anticipating problems	 Treat the deadline as the latest point for submitting coursework, not the earliest Seek advice from your department as soon as possible if you realise you may have difficulty meeting a deadline
Up to 48 hours after the deadline	 Work can achieve a maximum PASS grade of D- (UG) or C- (PGT), unless you have accepted <u>Mitigating Circumstances</u> With accepted Mitigating Circumstances, your work will not be capped
Between 48 hours and 5 working days after the deadline	 Work will be graded as Non Submission (NS), without accepted Mitigating Circumstances With accepted Mitigating Circumstances, your work will not be capped
More than 5 working days after the deadline	Work will not normally be accepted for marking
Re-assessment	• If you fail to submit an assignment, the Board of Examiners will decide if you are eligible for re-assessment at a capped grade
Coursework feedback	 Make full use of the support available in receiving and understanding feedback. Refer to the '<u>5 Core Principles</u>' for further guidance

Submitting coursework on time	 Provide students with a coursework schedule at the beginning of term, to help them to plan for deadlines Tell students how and where to submit their coursework If submitting on time is a professional requirement, make sure students know
Anticipating problems	 Highlight the submission deadline as the latest point for submitting coursework, not the earliest Encourage students to tell someone in their department as soon as possible, if they realise that they may have difficulty meeting a deadline
Up to 48 hours after the deadline	 Work can achieve a maximum PASS grade of D- (UG) or C- (PGT), unless students have accepted <u>Mitigating Circumstances</u> With accepted Mitigating Circumstances, work will not be capped
Between 48 hours and 5 working days after the deadline	 Work will be graded as Non Submission (NS), without accepted Mitigating Circumstances With accepted Mitigating Circumstances, work will not be capped
More than 5 working days after the deadline	Work will not normally be accepted for marking
Re-assessment	If an assignment is not submitted, the Board of Examiners will decide whether the student is eligible for re-assessment for a capped grade
Coursework feedback	 Provide students with timely, high quality feedback. Refer to the <u>'5 Core Principles'</u> for further guidance
