#### What is an Alumni Association?

- Groups provide a point of contact for alumni new to an area, they help to develop personal, social and professional networks and keep alumni in touch with Brunel.

#### **Benefits of an Alumni Association**

- Networking: Can lead to business collaborations, or professional development opportunities. Whether you are seeking a new member of staff or looking for a new job, an alumni group will enable you to meet people you could work with.
- Welcoming: There are many alumni that are new to the area or the country, who may need advice, recommendations or just a friendly group to help them feel settled.
- Mentoring: Meet inspirational and experienced people who can act as mentors. Feel fulfilled in helping others to learn from your skills and experience.
- Socialising: Relive your Brunel days by sharing memories, photos and experiences. Make new friends in your area and expand your social circles.

### What is involved in running a chapter?

Leadership: Each group will require a main point of contact for new members and to drive the group's activity. This person will be responsible for liaising with the Alumni Office about events and new group members. This person will have a profile on our website for people to contact.

Events: The group will decide how frequently they wish to meet. It could be monthly or less frequently, but we would recommend a minimum of two meetings a year.

Communication: We will set up an online group for members to connect with each other, share photographs of events and promote any upcoming gatherings or events.

Finances: Unfortunately, we are unable to provide large amounts of financial support so each chapter must aim to be self-financing. Applications for funding will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

## How will we support you?

**Promoting your events:** We will include your events on our online alumni network and our social media sites to help generate interest.

**Contacting Alumni:** We can connect you with alumni in your area and encourage them to join your group.

**Venue:** We can help with suggestions of suitable venues for group activities.

**Visitors:** We will let you know if Brunel staff are visiting your area so that your members have an opportunity to meet with them.

**Communications:** We will be in contact with you to check-in to find out how it is going, give you ideas for events and best practice and to share your ideas with others.

An online community: We will set-up a group for you to talk and interact with other global chapter members to share event ideas and photographs.



### Key expectations of a volunteer

- Be welcoming and to create a safe environment demonstrating respect and fair treatment of everyone.
- Demonstrate passion and commitment to the alumni association and to refrain from public criticism of fellow volunteers, staff or the university.
- Be organised in the management of your role and be responsive when communicating with our office.
- Overall, reflect the core values of Brunel University.
