

About University College Lillebaelt

- University College Lillebaelt (UCL) is one of seven university colleges in Denmark established January 2008.
- UCL covers part of the Southern Region of Denmark
- UCL in numbers:
 - ♦ 9 professional bachelor programmes with 7,000 students
 - ♦ Continuing professional development programmes with 7,000 students
 - ♦ Course activities: 8,000 course enrolments annually
 - UCL runs five interdisciplinary Centres of Excellence
 - Employees: 722
 - ◆ Turnover: DKK 570 million annually



Degrees in the Danish Higher Education System

Danish higher education institutions use the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) for measuring study activities. 60 ECTS correspond to one year of full-time study.

The efficiency programme

- A collaboration between the Ministry of Education and Research and the seven university colleges.
- Program established mid-2012 in continuation of the Parliament's disposal of 127.8 million. DKK on Finance Law 2012 to support joint efficiency solutions within the university colleges (UC) administration and study administration.
- Efficiency was targeted at:

- Operating expenses excl. postage
- Savings on handling material
- WISEflow (Digital Exam Support) was purchased for 6 University Colleges in 2014 and implemented at these institutions in 2014-15
