Brunel Central Admissions Teams Screening

Applications are assessed against Brunel Medical School's (BMS) academic and non-academic criteria. Applicants who meet, or are predicted to meet, the general and minimum academic requirements advance to Stage 2. Those who don't are rejected.

2

BMS Admissions Team Screening

Personal statements and references are reviewed by the Brunel Medical School Selection Panel.

Applicants with satisfactory personal statements and references are ranked using pre-determined criteria including their University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) score. The highest ranked applicants are invited to register for an interview. The remaining applicants are placed on an interview waiting list and may be invited to interview at a later date.

Online Multiple Mini Interviews (MMI)

Our interviews consist of six stations. These are scored individually and then aggregated. Our interviews normally take place between December and April each year.

4

Ranking

Candidates are ranked according to their MMI score. Candidates' MMI scores are presented to the Admissions Committee and a cut score is agreed, based on cohort performance.

Applicants reaching the cut score are offered a place or added to the Offer Waiting List, according to the number of places available.

5

Offers

Offers are made to those applicants ranked most highly in their MMI performance subject to the availability of places. UCAT scores and academic grades are considered to determine the offers between applicants with equal MMI scores. Those on the offer waiting list are made offers as places become available.
