Your study options

Study at Brunel for up to one year whilst earning credits to transfer back to your home institution.

Study Abroad programme

You can apply to become a Brunel student under our Study Abroad programme. This option is ideal if you want to spend a period of time studying in the UK while still earning credits to transfer back to your home institution. Tuition fees at Brunel start from £8,485 for a single term and £16,975 for the full year.

You'll need to complete 60 credits per term. We advise that you select a few alternative modules, as we're unable to guarantee that you'll be able to register for your first choice. A full list of available modules can be found at brunel.ac.uk/your-study-options

Entry requirements

You can apply to study at Brunel if:

- You're currently enrolled at an overseas university, college or higher education institution, and have completed at least one year of study.
- Hold a minimum GPA of at least 2.8 or equivalent. Students who don't meet the minimum requirement may be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- If English isn't your first language, you'll need to submit evidence of your English language ability. Our courses typically require an IELTS score of 6.5, but individual programmes may have additional requirements.

In order for us to process your application, you'll also need to submit the following supporting documents:

- Academic transcripts
- English language qualification
- Copy of valid passport (or EU identification card if applicable)
- Module selection form
- Proof of funds.

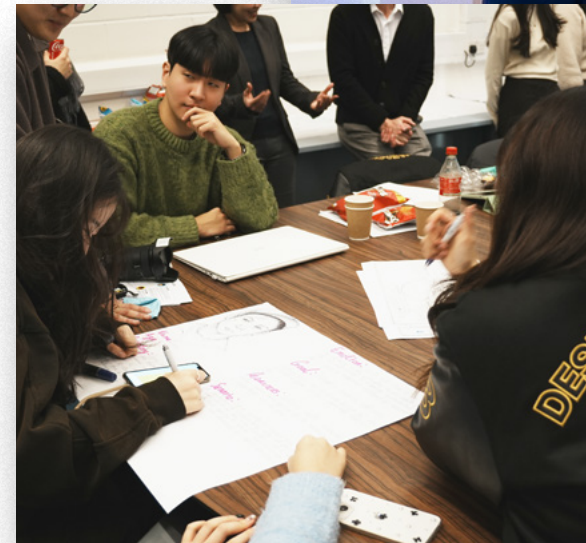
Made in Brunel
