Academic Word: facilitate (v) /fə'sɪl.ɪ.teɪt/

Meaning: to make something possible or easier

At Brunel Language Centre, English teachers facilitate learning by preparing engaging lessons and checking that students understand what they have been taught.



Collocations: 'to greatly facilitate something' / 'help to facilitate'

Examples: The use of virtual reality has helped to facilitate

learning among diverse students.



General English Expression: 'You're kidding!'

Meaning: This is used to show that you are very surprised

by what was said and do not accept it.

To kid (v) actually means to joke so it is as if you are saying 'you're joking'. A similar expression

is 'You must be kidding!'.

Example: "He said he lost the money you gave him."

"You must be kidding."

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
