

Self-employed Placement

Experience becoming your own boss





Are you thinking of starting your own business, social enterprise or being self-employed? Instead of undertaking an industrial placement, you could be your own boss!

This option is an alternative placement experience where you can set up a business or become self-employed for the year with the support of the Entrepreneur Hub (part of Brunel Careers, Student Professional Development).

Is this option for you?

What would you gain?

- Opportunity to develop and trial a business idea with a training and support programme created by the Entrepreneur hub
- Opportunity to 'be your own boss'
- Develop a wide range of transferable 'life' skills that greatly increase your employability
- Enjoy a huge sense of personal satisfaction and achievement
- Have the time to spend up to a year (minimum of 30 weeks) exploring, researching and starting a business

What do you need?

- Desire to run your own business, social enterprise or to be self-employed / freelancer
- An idea for a product or service which you are capable of delivering to customers
- Organisation, commitment and personal drive this is NOT an easy option
- Self-discipline

What would you miss?

- You will miss out on colleagues, corporate and workplace experience
- A regular salary
- Employer reference on CV

What would you need to do?

- Satisfy academic needs of sandwich year
- Devote proper time and energy to your business
- Attend training week and quarterly reviews, providing evidence of business progress
- Be approved by your placement advisor, department and Entrepreneur Hub

Process explained

Step 1

If your course offers a placement year and you have a fantastic freelance or business idea, present it to your department and discuss if it aligns with your course's learning objectives.

Step 2

After that, your department will direct you to Student Professional Development (SPD) team, where you will be introduced to the Entrepreneur Hub and required to schedule a meeting. Following this meeting, if they feel your idea is suitable for the placement option, they will invite you to complete an online Self-employed Placement Application Form.

Step 3

Once you have submitted the online application form, the Entrepreneur Hub will review it and get in touch with you.

Step 4

If the Entrepreneur Hub approves your application, you must then complete a Placement Approval Form (PAF) and submit it to your placement advisor in the SPD.

Step 5

Once your PAF has been approved your Self-employed Placement is officially confirmed.

Step 6

- Use the Entrepreneur Hub's support and services throughout the year.
- Attend compulsory monthly online reviews and provide monthly updates on your progress.
- Attend recommended Entrepreneur Hub workshops and events throughout the academic year that will help you with your journey to starting up your business, from business modelling workshops to networking, negotiation and pitching workshops.

- One to one consultations
- Expert advice and support
- Workshops, competitions and events
- Cash bursaries may be available

Eligibility criteria

Applicants must

- Be eligible to take a placement year as part of your degree course
- Be able to achieve all your learning outcomes (agreed on PAF)
- Complete your module assessments (agreed with course tutor)
- Have a viable business plan (agreed with the Entrepreneur Hub)
- Work full time on your business for a minimum of 30 weeks
- Not complete more than 15 hours of non-placement related paid work per week over the period
- Financially support yourself for the period
- Have considered and agreed in advance a placement fall back plan

Please Note: While we encourage innovation and creativity, the university cannot support all business ideas, such as those that we deem inappropriate, dangerous, or against university policy. Examples of such ideas include (but not limited to): non-scalable low-growth business models, on-campus food stalls or unlicensed catering, inappropriate or non-ethical content (e.g. adult content, gambling, alcohol, weapons, or anything illegal), get-rich-quick schemes/MLMs. To determine if your idea is eligible for this scheme, it's important to speak with your Entrepreneur Hub consultant before proceeding.

FAQ's

Q) Can I work with another student?

A) Yes, we accept business partnerships but recommend no more than 2 students.

Q) When does Placement start/finish?

A) This placement can start any time after studies are completed and needs to end prior to studies resuming.

Q) Can International students apply?

A) Due to VISA restrictions, only UK home students are able to apply.
