1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1. Placement route programmes

If you have chosen a programme of study that includes a placement, please take note of the following information:

Placement Fees

- For Undergraduate (Thin Sandwich and Thick Sandwich) and Postgraduate Taught 'Extended Professional Practice' courses with a one year placement, there will be a tuition fee for the placement year of £1385 for courses commencing in 2022.
- For Postgraduate Taught non-professional courses with a placement lasting less than 12 weeks, the placement carries no additional tuition fee.

• Placement Travel and Accommodation Costs

You may incur additional costs pertaining to travel and accommodation in relation to your placement. Your College will be able to provide you with further advice and guidance about this as you approach your placement year.

1.2. Costs associated with Remote Learning

At the time of writing we cannot confirm whether the teaching of courses in the 2022/3 academic year will be impacted by social distancing measures in the way that courses taught in 2021/2 have been as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Students should also equip themselves with suitable wet and cold weather outdoor clothing and footwear. - Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): The Department provides suitable personal protective equipment (e.g. boots, goggles, gloves) when needed. Students may wish to purchase their own PPE, but should check with the Department first to ensure the health and safety requirements are met. - Posters/Binding costs: £30-50

This should run Windows 10, have a minimum 8GB RAM and an Intel Core i5 processor or equivalent, have remote learning capabilities including web camera, microphone and audio jack. Students will be asked to purchase a range of drawing materials in their first year including sketchbooks, pencils and markers. In total this may cost in the region of £80. Students may have to purchase some specific materials and parts for modules such as Design Process Two, Embedded Systems, Contextual Design and for their final year Major Project. However, the majority of materials for projects such as wood, metal, plastics and model board are normally supplied free of charge from the workshops. Students may have to incur costs for presentation materials, including large scale printing of presentation posters/catalogues/brochures/process books.
Mathematics (All Department of Mathematics courses)	scale printing of presentation posters/catalogues/brochures/process books for Major Projects, Contextual and Graphic Design modules. - It is recommended that students purchase a calculator. The only calculators we allow in exams are Casio fx-83 and fx-85 (any suffix). 	 Field Trips: Compulsory field work in the UK requires no financial contribution (including residential field trips), but students may be required to pay for their transport to and from non-residential field locations in the London area. Students are required to contribute to the cost of additional optional field trips, both in the UK and overseas. Destinations can vary and are dependent on options chosen. Costs range from approximately £400 to £1500, and some trips have additional transport costs. Places on field trips may be limited and will be allocated to those interested at random, if oversubscribed. Where necessary, students are required to secure their own visas for international travel.

Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS)

(Brunel Medical School)

Visits to Hospitals and GP Practices

Throughout the 5-year Medicine MBBS course, Brunel Medical School (BMS) students will complete clinical placements across Primary Care, Secondary Care, Community Care and Mental Health. Year 1 and 2 placements will mainly be in Primary Care, with the majority located in proximity to the campus. In Years 3 - 5 students will be placed at NHS hospitals in and around the local area, while also travelling to Primary Care and Mental Health placements. In addition, students will attend one week on campus at the start of each study block.

Students will need to fund their own placement travel, which will range from **£500 - £2,500 per year**. Travel costs will be towards the lower end in years 1 and 2.

Shared private transport may be required on occasion.

Additional Costs (per annum)

- Stethoscopes: Students will need to purchase a stethoscope as part of their medical training. Costs of stethoscopes are approximately £100.
- Lab coats: The University will supply lab coats. Students may be required to pay £15 for replacements if lost or damaged.
- Poster Presentation Costs: £30-50.
- MDU / MPS membership: This is free and compulsory.
- *Laptop:* Students will be expected to have a laptop computer to be used for coursework, digital examinations, independent work and in class teaching sessions.

Placement Travel and Placement Accommodation costs

Some students that meet the eligibility criteria (<u>linked here</u>) may be able to claim the travel and accommodation costs relating to their placements, as determined by the guidelines set by the Government (Business Services Authority). If students are not eligible to claim back travel or accommodation expenses, travel will normally cost between £500 - £1000 per programme, depending on the location of the placements.

Students may be allocated a placement which requires them to source local accommodation for the duration of the placement (this might be 4 weeks or 8 weeks in length). Students will therefore need to be prepared to finance the accommodation themselves if they are not eligible for reimbursement.

PGCE Primary and Secondary (all programmes)

- Travel costs to placement schools can vary considerably with personal circumstances, including where student teachers live. The highest travel cost seen during the last academic year was as high as £30 per day for a student living a long way out of our partnership area; for most students it is considerably less. There are a minimum of 120 placement days in the course; commonly this is closer to 125. The monthly training bursary, for students in receipt of it, is intended to offset the cost of these out-of-pocket expenses. Primary PGCE students do not receive a training bursary so travel will be at their own expense.
