1.1 Placement route programmes

If you have chosen a programme of study that includes a placement, please take note of the following information:

Placement Fees

For Undergraduate (Thin Sandwich and Thick Sandwich) and Postgraduate Taught courses 'with Extended Placement.'

For Undergraduate courses there will be a tuition fee for the placement year of £1385 for courses commencing in 2026.

For Postgraduate Taught courses 'with placement', the placement carries no additional tuition fee.

Placement Travel and Accommodation Costs

You may incur additional costs pertaining to travel and accommodation in relation to your placement. Your College will be able to provide you with further advice and guidance about this as you approach your placement year.

BA (Hons) Education (Department of Education)	 Travel costs of £50 associated with compulsory and optional field trips each year. Travel costs linked to attending 72 hours of placement each year. Enhanced DBS check*: DBS applications (completed in the UK): £56.73 Digital ID or Digital Virtual ID check: £5.00 (payment made in the DBS application portal). No charge if carried out on Brunel campus, £14.36 charge if the ID check is carried out at a Post Office. If your DBS is lost, expires or does not reach you, the applicant/student is responsible for the cost of any future DBS applications. We recommend that you subscribe to the DBS Update Service, this service allows individuals to keep their DBS certificates up to date, so you don't have to apply for multiple DBS's and also allows employers to check a DBS certificate status. This is especially for students undertaking NHS placements that require the DBS to be no older than 12 months in the second year of the course. The service costs £16 per year and you must register for the Update Service within 30 days of a new DBS certificate being issued. BA (Hons) English (All Pathways)	Although library copies of primary texts are generally made available, students may prefer to purchase their own hard copy or

BA (Hons) Film Production and Television Studies (All Pathways) (Department of Arts and Humanities)	In addition to the tuition fee there may be additional costs for things like hard drives and other production-related items.
BA (Hons) Film Production (Department of Arts and Humanities)	In addition to the tuition fee there may be additional costs for things like hard drives and other production-related items.
BA (Hons) Film Production and Theatre (Department of Arts and Humanities)	- There are no compulsory additional costs for this programme. However, students will be asked to wear working clothes (such as t-shirts and joggers) during training and rehearsal sessions. All students will have access to some funding for fieldwork. - There are two compulsory modules that require students to print posters at a cost of approx. £20.
BASc (Hons) Global Challenges (Department of Arts and Humanities)	 Students are expected to complete a mandatory Enterprise Project in Year 3 - an individual internship or a group project with an institution - usually in London. Students would have to cover their commute/travel for this. Students may also incur costs associated with dissertation research. Students may also have to pay for poster printing (about £20).
BA (Hons) Journalism (All Pathways)	- Students wishing to gain NCTJ accreditation have their initial exam fees paid by Brunel. If they are required to re-sit, they will typically incur costs of approx £50 to £60 per module.

Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) (Brunel Medical School)	Visits to Hospitals and GP Practices Brunel Medical School (BMS) students complete clinical placements in Primary Care, Secondary Care, Community Care, and Mental Health over the course of the 5-year Medicine MBBS course. Year 1 and 2 placements are primarily in Primary Care, with the majority being close to campus. Students in Years 3 - 5 are assigned to NHS hospitals in and around London, as well as Primary Care and Mental Health placements. In addition, at the start of each study module, students spend one week on campus.

Students are responsible for funding their own placement travel, which costs between £550 and £2,760 per year. In years 1 and 2, travel costs are on the lower side.

On occasion, a shared taxi may be required.

An NHS Bursary is available for home students in their final year, more information can be found here: Student Services | NHSBSA Student Selected Component (SSC) Travel

Students may select SSC projects based off campus for example in affiliated NHS trusts. These projects are completed in year 2 of the programme over a 7-week period. Students are expected to fund transport costs, which depend on the location of the SSC and form of transport, but typically could be between £12-£70 per week.

Student Elective

In year 5 of the MBBS students will have a 7-week elective period incorporating 5 weeks of clinical placement and 2 weeks of vacation. Students' electives may take place either in the UK or abroad. The elective placement is self-funded; the university does not pay for travel or lodging.

The cost will vary considerably depending on the location; for example, flights, insurance, health checks and vaccinations will add to the cost. Students seeking a more cost-effective elective frequently look to the UK.

Additional Costs (per annum)

- Stethoscopes: Students need to purchase a stethoscope as part of their medical training. Costs of stethoscopes are approximately £100 for an entry level Litmann Stethoscope.
- Lab coats: The University supplies lab coats. Students may be required to pay £15 for replacements if lost or damaged.
- Poster Presentation Costs: £30-50.
- Medical Defence Union (MDU) and Medical Protection Society (MPS) membership: This is free and compulsory.
- *Laptop*: Students are expected to have a laptop computer to be used for coursework, digital examinations, independent work and in class teaching sessions.
- *Immunisation checking*: All students are required to confirm their immunity and vaccination information to the University. More information can be found at

 - Home and Overseas fee-paying students completing the application outside of the UK:
 - o DBS application: No charge.

- ID check: professional verifier may charge a fee for this
- If your DBS is lost, expires or does not reach you, the applicant/student is responsible for the cost of any future DBS applications.
- Students need a valid DBS for the entirety of the course and are required to renew the DBS after 3 years, alternatively we recommend students subscribe to the DBS Update Service once they have a Brunel DBS. Subscription currently costs £16 a year and more information can be found here: <u>DBS Update</u> Service - GOV.UK

- Criminal Record Declaration: Applicants with an overseas fee status are required to confirm the presence of any offences in their home country. Applicants can complete a Certificate of Good Conduct/in country Police Check or a Statutory declaration, the cost will vary depending on the type of check and your location.
